Major Achievements

El Paso County Sheriff's Office 2019 Illegal Marijuana Enforcement Efforts



- 5,938 plants seized (Street Value of \$5,938,000 at \$1,000 per plant)
- 1,205 pounds of processed marijuana seized (Street Value of \$4,217,500 at \$3,500 per pound)
- \$152,712 in cash seized

Public Works



- 4,407 Lane Miles
- •2,324 Lane Miles Paved•2,083 Lane Miles Gravel
- 270 Bridges
- 55 County-wide construction projects in 2019
- •68 Lane Miles of Chip Seal
- •152 Lane Miles of Dust Abatement
- •46 Lane Miles of Pavement Overlay
- Cost Saving Measures
 Brine System expanded to outlying yards
 Saves snow plows time and distanced during storms

WORKFORCE

- Successfully placed 13,910 people at an average annual wage of \$45,393 (\$11,364 more than the annual wage for all new hires in 2018)
- \$158.07 million in new worker earnings
- For every public dollar invested in workforce development activities in El Paso and Teller Counties, the return is \$22.76 in value-added worker earnings.

District Attorney



- Felony filings in El Paso County are up 53% over the past 5 years
- 33,493 cases were prosecuted
- \$5,758,884 was collected in restitution for victims of crimes
- 14 Homicide cases were taken to trial

Human Services



- 16,503 reports of Child Abuse and Neglect
- \$7.9 million (average) in Food Assistance each month
- 753 Out-of-Home placements for children living in foster/kin care in 2019
- El Paso County protects its most vulnerable citizen by providing a nurse to accompany a caseworker on every hotline call involving a child under 3 years old

2020 Census

- El Paso County is taking an active role in community outreach for the upcoming 2020 Census
- El Paso County had 10,000 undercounted citizens in the last Census that resulted in approximately \$150,000,000 loss in federal government revenue
- El Paso County will leverage staff and resources to reach and engage citizens to take the Census through social media and making computers available at locations within the county for citizens to take the Census
